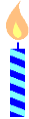

Presbyterian lingo that you may be hearing....

Pulpit supply: These are the week by week changing pastors we've had since Drew left. Pulpit supply pastors only lead worship on Sunday.

Temporary supply Pastor: This is a longer term contractual relationship, made through the Council and voted on by the Presbytery. Rev. Beth Illingworth has entered a three-month contractual relationship with St. Peter's Church through December. She will work full time. Her responsibilities include moderating council meetings, providing pastoral care and leading worship.

Interim Minister: This is a minister trained to lead congregations through times of transition. It is their responsibility to help a congregation prepare for a new pastor.

The council has the responsibility to hire the interim minister. This involves completing the Ministry Information Form found at...
